






# EGG AND SPOON RACE

Decorate some eggs with friends and family. Once you've finished mark out a starting line and finishing line using jumpers or towels. Balance your egg on your spoon and start the race! Go as fast as you can without dropping the egg, if it falls, start again. The winner is whoever crosses the finishing line first.



#### Create some chocolate

# EASTER EGG NEST CAKES

#### **Ingredients**

- 225g/8oz dark chocolate, broken into pieces
- 2 tbsp golden syrup
- 50g/2oz butter
- 75g/2<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>oz cornflakes
- 36 mini chocolate eggs

# Step 1

Line a 12-hole fairy cake tin with paper cases.

# Step 2

Melt the chocolate, golden syrup and butter in a bowl set over a saucepan of gently simmering water (do not let the base of the bowl touch the water). Stir the mixture until smooth.temperature.



## Step 3

Remove the bowl from the heat and gently stir in the cornflakes until all of the cereal is coated in the chocolate.

## Step 4

Divide the mixture between the paper cases and press 3 chocolate eggs into the centre of each nest. Chill in the fridge for 1 hour, or until completely set.

## **Recipe Tips**


Shredded wheat or puffed rice cereals can be used instead of the cornflakes. Store the Easter egg cakes in an air-tight tin for up to a week.


