



Accessibility Statement

In line with [schedule 10 of the Equality Act 2010](#) and the Department for Education (DfE) [guidance for schools on the Equality Act 2010](#), all of our schools have an accessibility audit, completed every 3 years, and resulting action plan. Each plan is available online on the school's website, with paper copies available upon request.

The action plan is reviewed at least annually by each school Principal and the Trust Estates team and re-audited every 3 years.

At the Nene Education Trust, we recognise, welcome and respect diversity, treating all pupils fairly and with respect. Each pupil is of equal value and we foster positive attitudes and relationship to share a sense of belonging. We are committed to ensuring equality of opportunity for all: pupils, staff, parents and carers and to continually developing a culture without discrimination of any kind. We strive to provide an environment where everyone connected to the school feels proud of their identity and is able to participate fully in school life. We observe good equalities practice, including staff recruitment, retention and development and training.
